

A Brief Introduction Of Collars

Collaring Is The Term Commonly Used By Those In The BDSM Community. It Carries The Same Type Of Weight And Depth Of Commitment That A Wedding Ring Does. It Does Not Matter What Form Of BDSM You Practice It Is A Universally Recognized Symbol Of Being In A Committed Relationship.

Traditionally, When A submissive Is Collared To A Dominant , You Become Owned, His Possession, He Becomes Responsible For Guiding you, Your Behaviours, Training You And He Is Responsible For Nurturing your Mind, Body And Soul. This, Is A Huge Responsibility, And Not One To Be Taken Lightly. It Is A Deep, Serious, Committed, Lifetime Relationship. It Is Something That Should Never Be Rushed Into. You Need To Understand What The Collar Means To Your Prospective Dominant So You Can Both Enjoy Your Journey Together In The Lifestyle. To Collar Someone And To Accept A Collar, Should Be Such An Honour, Not Only To The Submissive But To The Dominant As Well

Here OnLine There Are So Many Different Collars And Meanings, However, There Are 3 Main Collars Used Real Time:

Collar Of Consideration "The Exploring Stage" This Collar Is Traditionally Given At The Very Beginning Of A Potential Relationship. This Is Expressing An Interest In Pursuing A Relationship With A submissive Beyond That Of A Casual Acquaintance. The Collar Acts To Openly Declare To Other Dominant's That This submissive Is "Off-Limits" And That Honourable Dominant's Should Not Pursue This submissive In Any Manner.

Training Collar This Collar Represents The Second Collar Exchanged Between A Dominant And A submissive. This Is Offered By The Dominant After They Have Engaged In A Period Of Time Where They Have Held Extensive Lifestyle Conversations And Explored Each Other's Sexual Needs, Desires, Personalities, Dreams, Hopes And Goals In Order To See If They Prove To Be A Good Match Enough To Move Into A Relationship Of A Deeper Commitment. Most Enter A Deeper Emotional Stage At This Point And May Begin To Express True Devotion, Love, Honour And Mutual Respect.

Formal or Slave Collar This Is The Representation Of The Final Stage Of Commitment. It Expresses The Belief That The Dominant And submissive Share A Genuine And Growing Desire To Share In Each Other's Lives, Perhaps The Rest Of Their Lives.

There Was A Time When A Collar Was More Important Than A Wedding Ring But Since The Advent Of The Internet, This Ritual Has Been Turned Into Something Casual. Collaring Is Never Taken Lightly By Any Who Truly Honours And Respects The BDSM Lifestyle. The Significance Of The Collar Should Never Be Forgotten. A Collar Should Be Offered Seriously And With Intent, The submissive Accepting This Collar From A Dominant Should Be Equally Serious. It's Should Not Be A Decision That's Made Quickly And Tossed Aside In A Week. We Find This Is A Common Online Habit. Think Before You Jump Into A Velcro Collar It's A Commitment That Should Bind A Master And submissive

Together, Be Sure You Are Ready To Uphold The Traditions Behind The Collar Before Offering Or Accepting It.

You Will Find Players, Wannabies And Predators That Are In It For Their Own Self Gratification. I Have Noticed So Called Dominants That Have Collared A New And Different submissive Weekly. This Kind Of Disrespect Towards The "Collar" Is Disgraceful. Those Who Accepts A Collar Casually, Taking A New "Master" Every Week, Are Frowned Upon Within The Communities, And Quickly Becomes A Joke. These Types Have No Resemblance In Meaning To A True Collar. Any True Dominant Will Not Be So Hasty In The Collaring Of A submissive. Please... Take Your Time, Choose Wisely And Eventually Find Your Soul Mate. Many BDSM People Have Become Involved Online And Moved On To Happy Real Time BDSM Relationships.

Many BDSM Couples Have Held Online Collaring Ceremonies To Symbolize Their Commitment To Each Other. Like Wedding Ceremonies, They Can Be Very Beautiful, Touching And Emotional. This Can Be A Very Loving Way To Formalize Your Online Relationship. Whether You Decide To Have A Formal Ceremony Or A Private One...Each BDSM Relationship Is Different And Should Be Symbolized According To The Needs Of The Dominant And submissive.

There Is A Protocol That Must Be Respected When Approaching Someone Who Is Collared. Most submissives Have In Their Online Bios And Profiles Regarding Their Status Of Being "Owned". Any Dominant Who Speaks To A Collared submissive In A Sexual Or Demanding Way Is Considered To Be In Breach Of Protocol And It Should Be Noted That Such Actions Can And Will Have A Serious Negative Impact Upon His Reputation Within The BDSM Communities. Those That Actively Devalue What Is Precious To Us In The Lifestyle Should Be Aware That Such Actions Shall Brand You As Being A Player. If You Are One Of These Types Then Perhaps It Is Best That You Should Return To Your Own World Where Loyalty And Honour Is Non-Existent
